## POLICE AND CRIME COMMISSIONER ELECTIONS 15<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER

The first ever Police and Crime Commissioner elections will be held in November. The commissioner will be responsible for looking at how crime is dealt with in the area and to make sure that the police are providing a good service. The commissioner will regularly meet with the public and listen to their views on policing. The commissioner will also look at what the local crime priorities are and decide how the police budget will be spent to tackle crime. They will also be responsible for employing Chief Constables and dismissing them from their job if they are not providing a satisfactory service.

#### CHEAPER ROYAL MAIL STAMPS FOR PEOPLE ON BENEFITS - CHRISTMAS 2012

People who have Pension Credit, ESA or Incapacity benefits can buy Christmas stamps at 2011 prices (46p for 1<sup>st</sup> Class and 36p for 2<sup>nd</sup> Class). This scheme will start on 6 November and allows people on these benefits to buy 36 first or second class stamps at the reduced price.
